

Grab & Go!



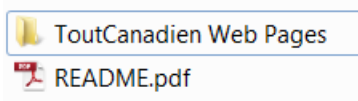
Ever happen upon a web site and didn't take the time to bookmark it by saving it in your Favorites folder? Later you regretted it because you never did find it again. Maybe you don't have time right now to look at something online, but you anticipate having time later, only problem is you know you won't have an Internet connection then. These things happen.


Better than a bookmark, better than a .pdf file, here's a zip file containing a copy of each page on the ToutCanadien web site (minus the contents of the Document Library, of course) that downloads in seconds.

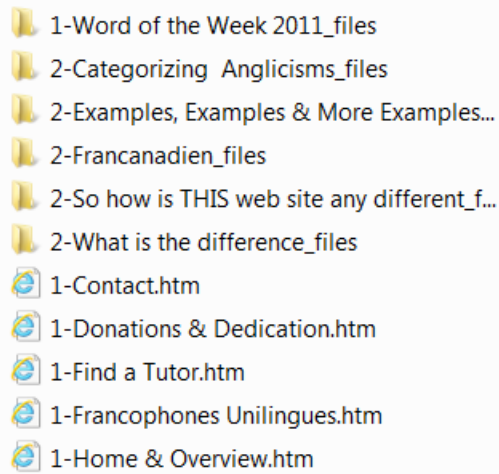
You must have a decompression/unzip utility loaded on your PC to work with zip files. There are many free unzip utilities on the Internet. Most new PCs already have something installed. Here is the one I use:

1. Click [here](#) to download the [ToutCanadien zip file](#).
❖ TIP – Save it to your desktop so it's easy to find.
2. Unzip/extract it by simply left-clicking on the file.
❖ TIP – If that doesn't work, try a right-click and look for “unzip” or “extract” or “decompress.”
3. Do not interrupt the decompression process, which you probably will be able to watch on your screen as it happens. When it's done, you'll notice a new folder on your desktop with the same name as the zip file.
4. Open this new folder that was created during the unzip process. This is what you should find inside:



5. Open the folder  ToutCanadien Web Pages . You'll find folders and files inside that look something like this:



(Do not move or delete anything inside this folder or a page will not open and display properly.)

6. The folders are yellow; just ignore these.
The files have the blue “e” and they all end in **.htm**
7. The files that correspond to the primary pages of the web site (the site’s navigation bar) all begin with 1.
8. The files that correspond to the secondary pages of the web site all begin with 2. (Secondary pages are pages that you would only be able to get to via a link found on a primary page. Secondary pages are not on the site’s navigation bar.)
9. So, you’re ready! Simply click the desired page and read it at your leisure.



- Remember—because these are real **.htm** web pages—once inside a page, if you click on a link, it will attempt to take you to the actual page on the web site; so just ignore the links.
- Forward the zip file to a friend!
- This zip file will be updated on an as-needed basis, so come back to the site to get the most current copy.
